Singing together helps your baby's brain to develop.



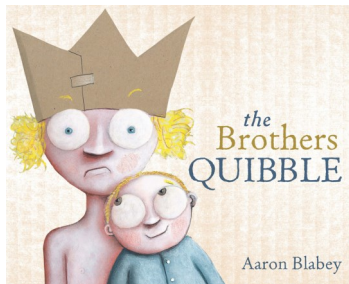
